Updates on Churchill Hall

Charity Rugby Match, March 2025

In 2019, James Johnson (Wills Hall 2019-20) started planning a charity rugby match to be played between Wills Hall and Churchill Hall. He decided to support the Ted Senior Foundation a charity set up in memory of a former graduate of Bristol who had moved to Swansea University and had sadly taken his own life in 2018. This inspired his family to set up a charity to improve mental health support and suicide prevention.

The inaugural match was planned for late March 2020 but for understandable reasons wasn't played until James was a final year undergraduate.



Discussions ensued between Charles Gunter (Wills Hall Association) and David Clarke CHA and resulted in the CHA agreeing to purchase a cup to mark the occasion and that was to be presented to the winning team.

The match was a victory to Churchill Hall, as were the three subsequent year's matches.

The fourth game took place this year on Friday 7th March 2025 with a change of venue, St. Brendan's Rugby Football Club.

Congratulations to Wills Hall who won 45 to 26.

Over £400 was raised for the Ted Senior Foundation.

It was noted that the Churchill Hall Association JCR used their initiative and found a sponsor to cover the cost of their new Rugby kit.

This year has seen the return of Rosie Harbour, head of north village student communities, from maternity leave and who provided our committee with an update on Churchill Hall activities:

The students have had a winter / Christmas dinner followed by a club event and a formal valentines dinner. They have been engaged with facilities regarding improving community spaces and making them more hospitable for the students.

There is a chief resident who supports Churchill who unfortunately does not live in, due to personal circumstances, but does work there twice a week and who has been supporting a north village cup by providing events for students in an informal light touch way. This including Mario Kart (Nintendo Switch console game), Giant Rock Paper Scissors (where the normal gestures used are exaggerated) and Touch Football (A variant of American football in which players are touched as opposed to tackled).

As mentioned there has also been the charity rugby match when the JCR tried to emphasise the charity raising aspect.

Sarah Price, who is a member of the University's alumni engagement & volunteering team, and who has been regularly attending our committee meetings, provided a reminder that the University can support alumni community activity through Alumni Association Initiative Grants.

Local Alumni Branches

Finance Update

Financial Report for the year to 31st March 2025

The activities of the Association during the year have been working in conjunction with the other Hall Associations and Alumni groups to arrange the Reunion Weekend. The Bristol Alumni Network (the organising group) agreed that the finances for the event would be handled by the Wills Hall Association, as they had the necessary facilities in place, and that any surplus would be held by WHA on behalf of the Network, to be available for future Reunions. Therefore, no transactions relating to the Weekend appear in our accounts.

The accounts, therefore, show the only income as the interest earned on accrued funds which covered the basic account fees for maintaining the bank account. The only other expenses are the costs of maintaining the Association website.

There was therefore a small shortfall of £38.08 for the year, meaning that the funds in hand amount to £3309.42. This is considered to be more than adequate to meet the expected financial needs of the Association over the immediate future.
