Chair's Annual Statement

Celebrating Churchill Hall's Diamond Anniversary

Churchill Hall marks a significant milestone this year as it celebrates its 70th anniversary, having opened in 1956. This diamond anniversary holds personal significance for me as CHA Chair, as I was also born in the same year.

Historical Overview

Churchill Hall was the second all-male residence established in Stoke Bishop, with Wills Hall being the first. Upon opening, Churchill Hall accommodated 111 male students, a Warden, and three tutors housed across one newly constructed block and three Victorian houses: Claverton, Waltham, and The Holmes.

In 1978, following a Junior Common Room debate and vote, the hall began admitting both male and female students.

The Holmes: A Unique History

The Holmes was once owned by Herbert Midelton Baker, nephew of William Mills Baker and cousin of Hiatt Baker. Their Baker & Baker Co. store in Bristol was destroyed during the blitz, prompting Herbert to sell The Holmes to the University. The property came with its butler, Henry Caine, who was born in 1897.

Following its acquisition, The Holmes was initially requisitioned by the American Army and served as the official residence for several senior American commanders, including Generals Collins, Hodge, Dever, Patton, and most notably General Omar Bradley, who were involved in planning the D-Day landings.

After World War II, The Holmes became part of Wills Hall and was later transferred to Churchill Hall when it opened. Henry Caine was still serving meals to students while I was there in 1978 aged 80 and we believe he only retires shortly before his death in 1983.

Anniversary Celebration Events

To commemorate this special occasion the Churchill Hall Association, in collaboration with the Bristol Alumni Network, has organised a day of events on Saturday 15 August, which is part of the annual Alumni Weekend running from 14 to 16 August.

Programme of Activities

The day will commence with a gathering in the Junior Common Room for coffee, tea, and pastries, providing an opportunity to share memories and enjoy a tour of Churchill Hall, guided by members of the current JCR.

There will be a guided tour of the Botanical Gardens, which were moved to the grounds of The Holmes in 2005. Attendees will also have the chance to view D-Day landings posters and photographs in The Holmes, alongside Churchill Hall archived materials, courtesy of the University's Special Collections.

Lunch will be available to purchase in the Botanical Gardens cafeteria.

After lunch, a boules match will be organised on the Churchill Hall Quad lawn (gather in the JCR). All are welcome to participate and enjoy the festivities and refreshments.

Alex Raikes, our Guest Speaker

This year's after-dinner speaker is Dr Alex Raikes, a Churchill Hall alumna. Alex leads the award-winning human rights charity, SARI (Stand Against Racism & Inequality) having joined the organisation shortly after graduating in Social Policy at Bristol in 1991.

She is a member of University of Bristol Court; was awarded an MBE in 2009 for her contribution to race relations; received an Honorary Doctorate from UWE and made Deputy Lieutenant in 2019; and was High Sheriff of the County of City of Bristol in 2022. She was awarded an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from Bristol in July 2023 and [you can read more here](#).

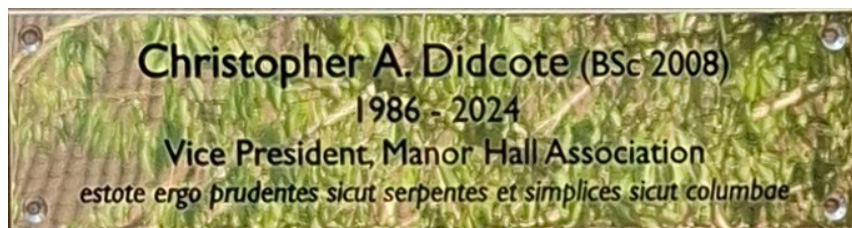
For former residents of Badock Hall it was an opportunity to join their celebrations of 60 years,

Updates

Charity Rugby Match: Will Hall vs Churchill Hall

Background

In 2019, James Johnson, a resident of Wills Hall during the 2019-20 academic year, began organising a charity rugby match to be played between Wills Hall and Churchill Hall. The chosen beneficiary for the event was [the Ted Senior Foundation](#), a charity created in memory of a former Bristol graduate who had moved to Swansea University and tragically took his own life in 2018. In response to this loss, his family established the foundation to promote better mental health support and suicide prevention.

Matches Played

The inaugural match was originally planned for late March 2020. However, due to unforeseen circumstances, the game was postponed and eventually took place when James was in his final year as an undergraduate.

Churchill Hall emerged victorious in this match, as well for two subsequent annual fixtures. The fourth match, held in 2025, saw a reversal of fortunes for Wills Hall, who secured a 45 to 26 victory. The event succeeded in raising £400 for the Ted Senior Foundation. The winners were presented with a cup purchased by the CHA.



This year's result

The fifth charity match took place this year on 26 April at Coombe Dingle. On this occasion, Churchill Hall claimed victory once again, with a final score of 62 to 38. Congratulations to the Churchill Hall team on their achievement!



News from Churchill Hall JCR Committee 2025-2026

This year we have been collaborating with the current and previous JCR committees to help organise the 70th year events and this year's president, Ben Lee, supplies the following update from hall:

I (Ben Lee- President) alongside Vice President Events (Amelie Cooper) and Vice President Finance (Will McIntyre) have thoroughly enjoyed being on the JCR committee this year and putting on events for all residents of Churchill Hall.

We started with a Winter Ball in December which involved a formal dinner followed by DJ sets in a decorated common room.

Our social media presence (@churchillhalljcr on Instagram) has allowed us to keep connected with residents and receive suggestions on future events. The popularity of the Winter ball led us to organise a midsummer themed spring formal which also included a formal dinner in the Churchill dining hall.



Right after we returned after the Easter break we organised a club night at Barbara's Bier Bar on the Harbourside, hiring out the entire club for all of the Churchill residents to socialise after the holidays.

This year we have helped organised a charity rugby match - which has been held for the past 5 years between Churchill and Wills Hall. The match took place in April and saw extensive support from students not just from Churchill and Wills, but from the wider first year cohort.

We have loved continuing the partnership with Winestock, an end of year ball on the Downs for University of Bristol students, and have been pleased to gain discounted tickets for Churchill residents. Additionally, we have worked alongside other JCR's to contribute to the University's Constitution Ball whereby we were able to provide Churchill residents discounted tickets for this large scale annual event to celebrate the end of the academic year.

Throughout the year we have been consistently engaged with the facilities team regarding improving student spaces even further, and making them more hospitable for students. Additionally, we have loved working closely with the Churchill Hall Association in the run up to the 70th anniversary celebrations!

This January, the University welcomed the Prince of Wales to tour the Isambard-AI supercomputer, as well as the Bristol Robotics Laboratory (BRL).

His Royal Highness had the opportunity to learn more about how Isambard-AI's impressive speed is powering research, something that has not been possible in the UK and globally until now.

The final stop of the day, at the BRL, included being introduced to the University of Bristol-led engineering research team at the VIVO Hub for Enhanced Independent Living. Finance Update for the year to 31st March 2026

As in previous years, the activities of the Association during the year have been working in conjunction with the other Hall Associations and Alumni groups to arrange the Reunion Weekend. **The Bristol Alumni Network (the organising group) agreed that the finances for the event would be handled by the Wills Hall Association, as they had the necessary facilities in place, and that any surplus would be held by WHA on behalf of the Network, to be available for future reunions. Therefore, no transactions relating to the Weekend appear in our accounts.**

The only income was the interest earned on accrued funds which covered the basic account fees for maintaining the bank account. During the year, the bank changed the terms of the bank account to remove the monthly "account" charge, which means that we are only charged for transactions where paper is involved. The main expenses are the costs of maintaining the Association website. Last year, there was an opportunity to purchase a perpetual licence to use the website theme which means that although the costs this year are higher, we will save money in future years.

There was also an additional cost as the Committee invited the 2025-2026 President of the JCR committee to a meeting of the committee with the new Chair of the Alumni Association.

Therefore there was a shortfall of £152.56 for the year, meaning that the funds in hand amount to £3,156.86. This is considered to be more than adequate to meet the expected financial needs of the Association over the immediate future.
